












She says: "My work has varied considerably over the years but enduring interests are colour, geometry and nature. I have bodies of work which reflect the light and land of Western Australia, others where the focus has been on kinetics in jewellery and then there was a focus on precious gemstones to translate the paintings of Austrian Gustav Klimt into jewels to wear." Her newest work, a tribute to her mother, the artist and author Dr Rica Erickson takes Western Australian wildflowers as their inspiration. As her grandfather had a goldmine she is also inspired by the precious metal and likes to use it in her work, often combined with steel cable or mesh. Many of the recent jewels are based on her mother's wildflower paintings. However they are not literal translations instead they are evocations of the colour, form or habit of Australia's unique wildflowers.

Her books are part of our heritage.


