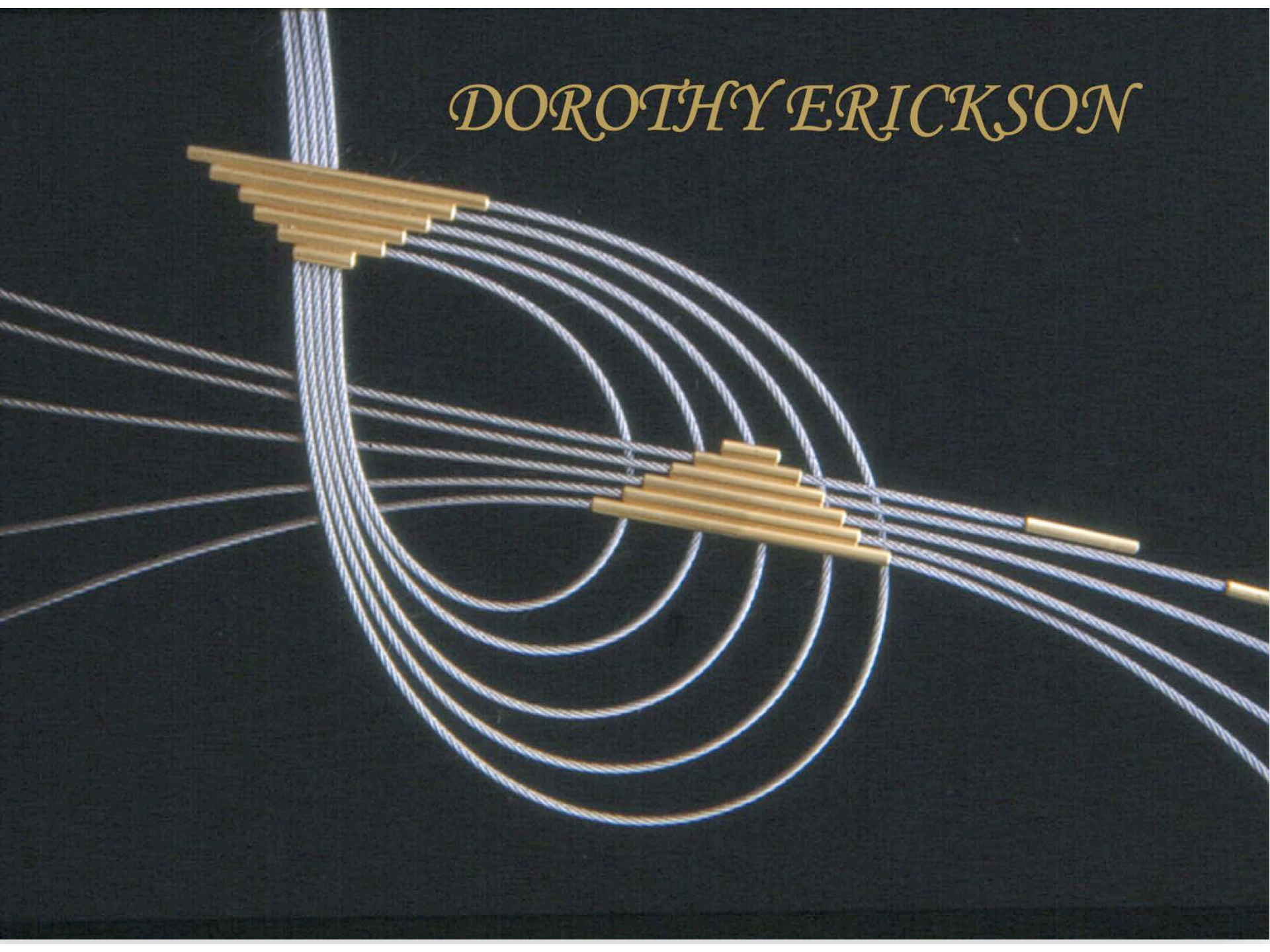


DOROTHY ERICKSON

She says: “My work has varied considerably over the years but enduring interests are colour, geometry and nature. I have bodies of work which reflect the light and land of Western Australia, others where the focus has been on kinetics in jewellery and then there was a focus on precious gemstones to translate the paintings of Austrian Gustav Klimt into jewels to wear.” Her newest work, a tribute to her mother, the artist and author Dr Rica Erickson takes Western Australian wildflowers as their inspiration. As her grandfather had a goldmine she is also inspired by the precious metal and likes to use it in her work, often combined with steel cable or mesh. Many of the recent jewels are based on her mother’s wildflower paintings. However they are not literal translations instead they are evocations of the colour, form or habit of Australia’s unique wildflowers.

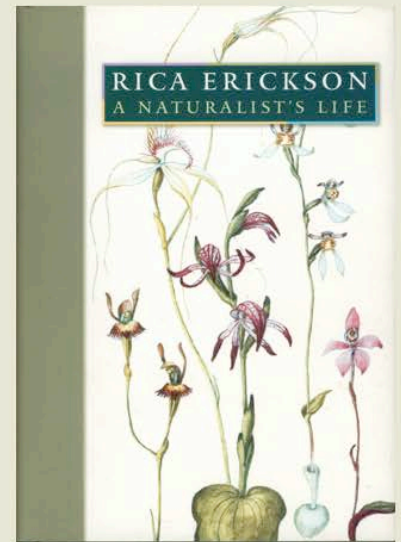
She died in 2009 at 101 having written many books and worked until her 99th year.

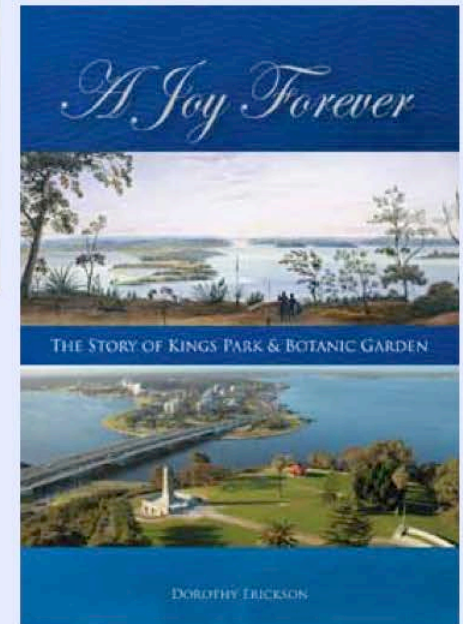


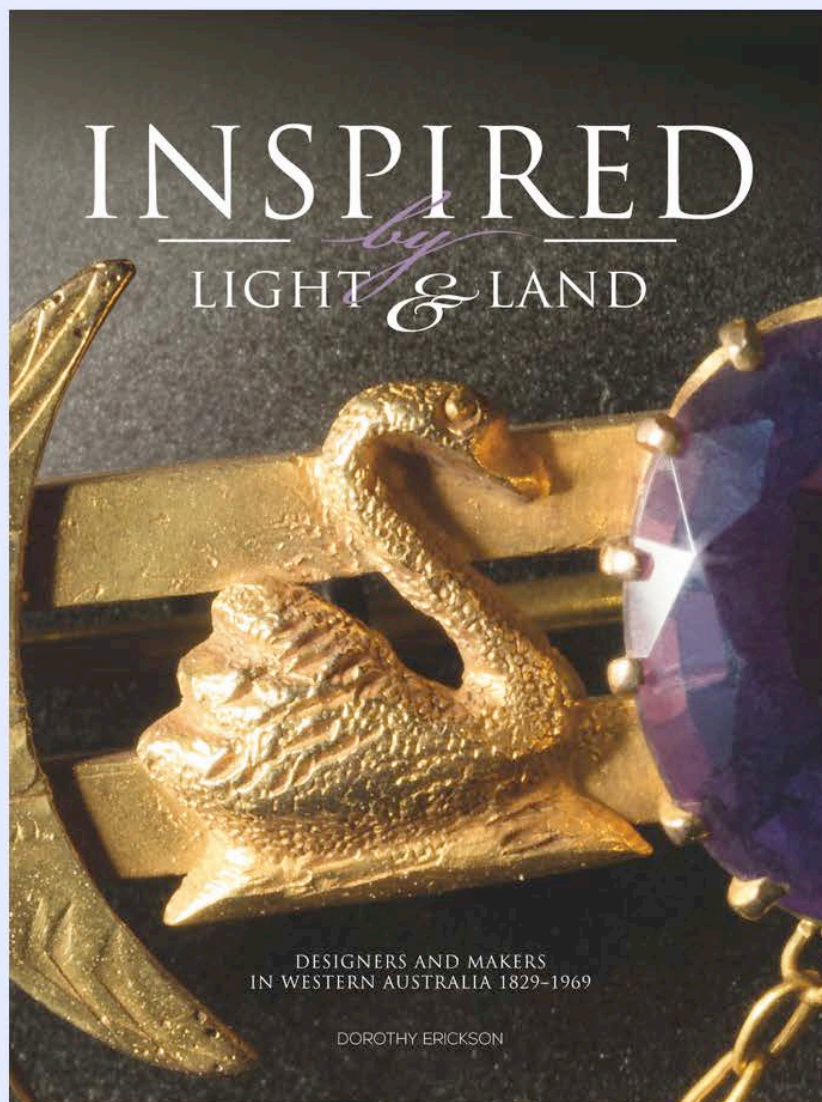
Gold & Silversmithing in Western Australia: A History

Dorothy Erickson

Dr Dorothy Erickson, an internationally exhibiting artist jeweller is the daughter of the eminent naturalist, wildflower painter and historian the late Dr Rica Erickson. Born and educated in Western Australia having degrees in education, art and design and a doctorate in art history from UWA she has lectured in jewellery and silversmithing, technology and design history. She was the President of the Craft Council of Western Australia, a Fellow and a Life Member, a research associate of the Western Australian Museum, a curator of forty years standing and founder of the Western Australian Jewellers Group (now JMGA WA Inc.) she is a well regarded writer on Western Australia's cultural heritage.



Commencing in the 1970s as an art critic she has travelled widely bringing an international perspective to her research and writing. Her books so far include *Art and Design in Western Australia: Perth Technical College 1900-2000*, *King's Park A Joy Forever, Gold and Silversmithing in Western Australia: A History and Inspired by Light and Land: Designers and Makers in Western Australia 1820-1900*, which was shortlisted for the Premier's Book Award in 2016. She won the State Heritage Award in the Individual category in 2017. Current projects include 'Inspired by Light and Land: Designers and Makers in Western Australia Pt. II 1960-2000' and 'A Pair of Spanish Eyes: The life and times of painter Miguel Mackinlay' for release in England.

A full colour, lavishly illustrated book by Dr Dorothy Erickson with a foreword by Professor Ted Snel, an essay by Mark Cartrell Freeman of the Worshipful Company of Goldsmiths London, photographs by Robert Frith and others is to be published by the Western Australian Museum.

A PASSION FOR SMITHING

PHILIP NOAKES: GOLD AND SILVERSMITH



Philip Noakes is one of the foremost silversmiths working and teaching in Australia. This book, that celebrates almost fifty years of his life designing and making in gold and silver is an important contribution to the history of Australian visual culture. It tells Philip's life story from his dream as a schoolboy to make objects of metal to his life as a successful silversmith and teacher. It traces his education at the Sir John Cass College of Art in London where he completed the technically demanding full time Diploma in the Design and Craftsmanship of Silversmithing, through working with the celebrated silversmith Louis Osman, his holiday trip to Australia where in the 1970s he worked with Eric Car in Fremantle

and decided to stay. It tells of his moving to Sydney where he worked as a jeweller while also making for the film, television and the fashion industries before opening a highly successful contemporary jewellery gallery with Kate O'Sullivan. It covers his return to Western Australia where he became the award-winning designer for Kallis Pearls, taught at TAFE and finally opened a private silversmithing and jewellery school, *Contemporary Metal*.

Each stage of his career is placed in the context of the times and examined for the impact on his practice. Significantly his achievements have been recognised in London in 2016 when he became a Fellow of the Institute of Professional Goldsmiths entitled to use the letters IPG after his name.

The book discusses the influences on his design concepts throughout his career, the people he has worked with, his working methods and values regarding art, design and skill, the role in education he has undertaken and significant exhibitions and commissions. The end focus is on events leading up to the major survey exhibition *Sculptural Silver* to be held at the Lawrence Wilson Gallery at the University of Western Australia in July 2019 and the significant body of work made for this.

This book celebrates the achievements of a major Australian designer maker in gold and silver — Philip Noakes.
