Dorothy Erickson is a Western Australian artist whose work has been informed both by her family heritage and the natural environment. The daughter of prominent naturalist, wildflower painter, historian, author and farmer's wife the late Dr Rica Erickson, Dorothy also had a paternal grandfather with a goldmine. She has pursued careers as a teacher and a jeweller exhibiting internationally since 1979. Her jewellery is in prestigious private collections, museums and art galleries worldwide. She says: "My work has varied considerably over the years but enduring interests are colour, geometry and nature. I have bodies of work that reflect the light and land of Western Australia, others where the focus has been on kinetics in jewellery. A major twenty-first century collection *HOMAGE to KLIMT* features precious gemstones to translate the paintings of Austrian Gustav Klimt into jewels to wear."

As the daughter of a naturalist Dorothy has been immersed in the unique flora that is Western Australia's heritage for as long as she can remember. She studied botany as part of a teaching degree and the 1960s saw her enrolling at the Chelsea Institute in London while researching Australian plants at Kew Herbarium and the Natural History Museum, South Kensington. Her interest in the minutiae of nature has never waned but it has only been since she researched to write the book *A Joy Forever: The Story of Kings Park* that she turned her attention to Australia's unique wildflowers as a subject for her jewellery. With her mother's death in 2009 this morphed into a collection *HER MOTHER'S DAUGHTER* in her honour. Many jewellery pieces are based on Rica's paintings. Few are literal translations, they are instead evocations of the colour, form or habit of individual species of Western Australia's precious and endangered heritage. Many of her works are kinetic, moving with the body.

A new collection CONNECTIONS exploring antecedents and their occupations has just commenced.

Dr Erickson is also a significant researcher, writer and art critic being published in Australian and international publications. She edited *Art and Design in Western Australia: Perth Technical College 1900-2000.* Her book *A Joy Forever: The Story of Kings Park* was published in 2009. *Gold and Silversmithing in Western Australia: A History* was published in 2010 and *Inspired by Light and Land: Designers and Makers in Western Australia 1829-1969* will be published in 2014.

HOMAGE TO KLIMT COLLECTION

Dorothy Erickson first visited Vienna in 1980 when she attended the World Craft Council Conference. Here she formed a friendship with jeweller Erika Leitner and was invited to hold a solo exhibition at the prestigious Galerie am Graben in 1983. Since then Dorothy has returned regularly to exhibit and work together with Erika in the latter's studio, meet with other Austrian jewellers and enjoy the life of this most sophisticated European city. The ambience and architecture of the city, the museums, galleries and the many Secession influences such as the U Bahn stations and the Secession building eventually led to an investigation and work based on the art of Gustav Klimt.

Having first trained as a painter the colours and combinations possible in today's gemstones stimulated her to think again with a painter's eye. Gemstones and coloured metal became her palette, one with an inner sparkle and depth to make the pieces sing. The ability to express this admiration as jewellery was facilitated by the availability of small multicoloured semiprecious and precious stones evocative of the tesserae of mosaics suggesting miniature paintings making it possible to create abstract evocations as well as more literal translations of Klimt's works which she has translated into sparkling wearable objects in gold, silver and precious stones.


